








PARCC ELA FINDINGS: 2016

- Increase in the percent of students meeting and exceeding expectations in all tested grades (3-11), ranging from 9% to 100%.




ELA Grades 3-11 Students Meeting/Exceeding

Math Grades 3-11 Students Meeting/Exceeding






Passaic High School 4-Year Graduation Rate






Passaic High School Number of 4-Year Graduates








Passaic High School SAT Participation
