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## 7250 - NAMING BUILDINGS AND PROGRAMS

The purpose of this policy is to establish criteria and a process for naming or renaming (i.e., granting “Naming Rights”) Passaic Public School physical assets [e.g., a school building, field, laboratory, classroom, gymnasium, auditorium, playground, garden area or other physical structure (hereafter “Buildings”)] and academic, athletic, artistic or other academic or co-curricular programs, (hereafter “Programs”) in recognition of a contribution to the Passaic Public School or education in general. This policy applies to granting Naming Rights to all Building of the City of Passaic Public Schools, and to all Programs under the authority of the City of Passaic Board of Education.

1. There are two distinct pathways to granting Naming Rights to a Building or Program:
  1. Honorary Naming Rights – naming in recognition of a non-monetary, extraordinary contribution to (i) the field of education, (ii) the City of Passaic Public Schools, (iii) a specific Passaic school, (iv) human betterment in general, or (v) historical figure.

The naming of a Building or Program in honor of an individual’s service is an extraordinary action by the Passaic Board of Education and should be done only under the most unique circumstances. This honor is reserved for individuals, families or groups of recognized accomplishment and character, which reflects honor on the District and its mission. The Board shall take all relevant factors into consideration in making its determination, which determination shall be at its sole discretion. Special consideration shall be given to the following factors:

- a. The historical significance of the contribution of the individual, family or group to the City of Passaic Public Schools or an individual school.
- b. The association of the individual, family or group with the Building or Program to be named.
- c. State, regional, national or international recognition of the individual’s family’s or group’s contributions and achievements toward human betterment.

An individual wishing to nominate an individual, family or group for such an honor should contact the President of the Board of Education. If the President believes the nomination meets the criteria above, he or she shall refer the nomination to the District Operation Committee consisting of three members of the Board of Education (of which the President serves as ex-officio). The committee will evaluate the nomination, based on the criteria above and noting the extraordinary nature of such an action. In addition, the committee can discuss other potential names for nomination. The committee will submit a recommendation to the Board, including its justification. Committee deliberations shall be kept confidential until its recommendation is received and discussed by the Board. If approved, the Board shall make known the naming, and conduct a dedication ceremony in a manner deemed appropriate by the Board.

The committee should not consider any nominations if the nominee falls into one of the below category:

1. Convicted of a serious crime or offense.
2. A current employee of the district.
3. A current elected official. (Must have been out of office for 10 years)
4. Donated monetary value, greater than \$250,000, to the district.
5. A current entertainer, sport figure, civic organizer, or leader.

## **7513 - RECREATIONAL USE OF PLAYGROUNDS**

The Board of Education requires that the playground of the school affords residents with a recreational area when school is not in session. The Board reserves the right to determine, in the interest of the safety of district residents and the integrity of the school facility, the uses to which the playground may be put and the hours when it may be used.

The Board will publish rules of conduct, which shall govern all persons who use the facilities of this district. Students and employees of this district who violate those rules will be subject to discipline. The Board directs that any other person who violates a rule of this Board be requested to leave the school premises.

Because of its potential for hazard, no object that is powered by fuel or battery shall be brought onto the school grounds for any purpose that is primarily recreational without the express permission of the principal. Such objects include, but are not limited to, mini-bikes, mopeds, motorized model airplanes, and rockets.
